Study of Europe in its entirety, with a particular emphasis on the **EU** dimension, from an internal but also from a global perspective



- Modules
- Chairs
- Centres of Excellence



Other fields of Education and Training

- Teacher Training
- Learning EU initiatives



Policy Debate

- Thematic networks
- An Economy that Works for People (internal)
- EU-Latin America (external)
- EU-Africa (external)





Module

- short teaching programmes or courses in the field of European Union studies
- minimum duration of 40 teaching hours per academic year
- one particular discipline in European studies or be multidisciplinary in approach
- direct contact hours (no individual tutorials)
- short specialised or summer programmes (distance learning)



Chair

- teaching posts with a specialisation in European Union studies
- held by only one professor (permanent staff members)
- minimum 90 teaching hours per academic year
- additional hours and support of other staff possible



Centre of Excellence

- focal points of competence and knowledge on EU subjects
- synergies between the various disciplines and resources in European studies
- reaching out to students from faculties not normally dealing with EU issues
- only one at a time per HEI
- should seek to become structured centres providing EU specific high level knowledge



Specifications

- 1. single HEI application
- 2. HEIs from all countries except Belarus and Russian Federation
- 3. duration: 3 years
- 4. maximum grant:
 - module: 35 000 €
 - chair: 60 000 €
 - centre of excellence: 100 000 €
- 5. co-financing: 75 % (module, chair); 80 % (centre of excellence)
- 6. funding model: fixed lump sum (module, chair); customized lump sum (centre of excellence)





Networks

- 1. in HE sector
- 2. in other fields of education and training
- collect, share and discuss among the partners research findings, content of courses and experiences, products
- establish a tool allowing the partners to share their academic works and run peer review exercises
- 1. An Economy That Worsk for People (internal EU issue)
- 2. EU Latin America (foreign policy issue)
- 3. EU Africa (foreign policy issue)





Specifications

- 1. application: 10 12 partners (depending on type of network)
- 2. HEIs from: EU member states or third countries associated to the programme + third countries not associated to the programme (depending on type of network, specific regions)
- 3. duration: 3 years
- 4. maximum grant: 1 000 000 € (internal) 1 200 000 € (external)
- 5. co-financing: 80 %
- 6. funding model: customized lump sum

- not yet open (except LI), deadline 1 February 2024, 17:00 CET

Lump sums models

Fixed lump sum

Module

according to teaching hours (120-360) and countries:

CZ, HU, SK: 18 000 € - 35 000 €

AT: 33 000 € - 30 000 €

Chair

according to teaching hours (270-750) and countries:

CZ, HU, SK: 30 000 € – 60 000 €

AT: 55 500 € - 60 000 €



1. fixed lump sum

2. customized lump sum

Customized lump sum

Other JMO actions

determined for each grant based on the estimated budget proposed by the applicant after assessment a lump sum will be established (80 % of estimated budget) following the maximum for each action



Application at FTOP

- register via EU login
- use PIC of your HEI
- Part A: online application form
- Part B: download, fill, upload (different for fixed and customized LS)
 - Excel sheet for budget
 - Word document for content
 - annexes





Award criteria

Criterion	Points
Relevance of the project	25
Quality of the project design and implementation	25
Quality of the partnership and cooperation arrangements	25
Impact	25
Total	100

to be eligible for funding = 70 points AND minimum 15 points in each criterion





Relevance of the project

- the extent to which the proposal meets the objectives of the Jean Monnet action
- how it addresses EU Studies
- the extent the proposal reaches priority target groups
- the relevance of the proposal to the priority subject as defined in the call (networks)





Quality of the project design and implementation

- methodology: quality, novelty and feasibility of the project itself and the viability of the proposed methodology
- monitoring and evaluation strategy
- work programme / packages
- quality of the proposed model for feeding EU policy (network)





Quality of the partnership and cooperation arrangements

- level of competence and added value of the team
- profile and expertise of the members of the team in European Union studies (Chair, CofE)
- cooperation arrangements inside the Higher Educating Institution and distribution of roles (CofE)
- internal organisation of the partnership (network)





Impact

- the expected impact of the project by having long lasting effects
- dissemination and communication
- the extent to which the dissemination tools foreseen will reach the target audience
- sustainability and continuation

Deadline for submission of applications	1 February 2024
Evaluation period	April – June 2024
Notification of results to applicants	Max. 6 months after submission deadline
Preparation of Grant Agreement/Decision	Max. 9 months after submission deadline

Tips for Applications

Be coherent!

Avoid contradictions and "cut and paste" style applications

Be explicit!

Take nothing for granted and don't assume that experts have prior knowledge in your area. Avoid abbreviations or explain them.

Be clear!

Read the questions carefully, provide information in the correct order as indicated in the form.

Be concrete!

Use examples, justify your claims, provide evidence.

Be realistic!

The application is the basis of your project to be; it is also the cornerstone of the commitment you will sign.

Keep it simple!

Use short sentences, vary the length if you wish to make it more interesting but keep it simple and focused.

Remain focused!

Concentrate exclusively on what is asked of you.

Double-check your proposal!

Make sure you have followed all instructions and the proposal meets all mandatory requirements.
