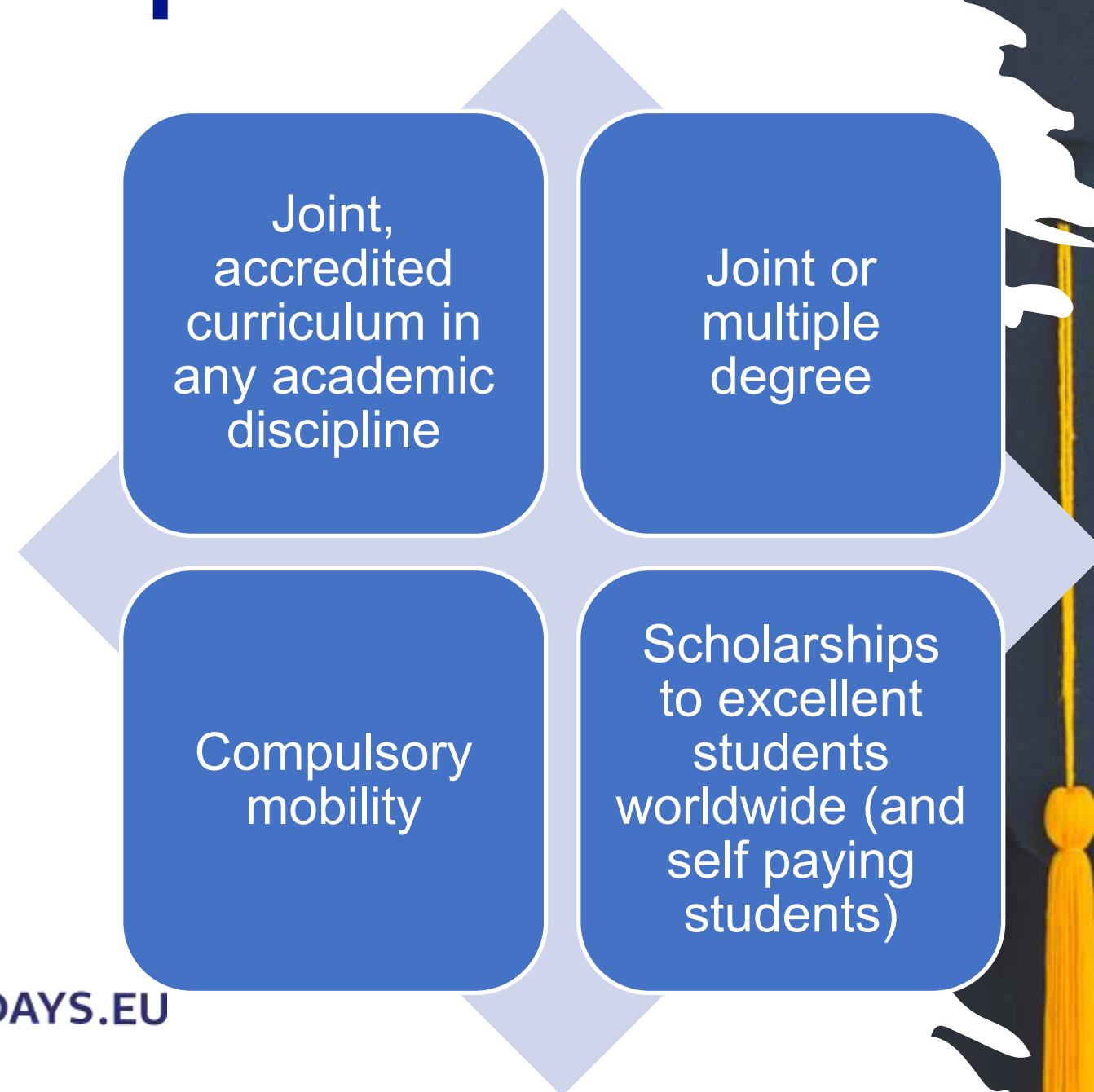

Erasmus Mundus – at a glance

- High quality, jointly developed master programmes
- Objectives:
 - Foster international cooperation between HEIs
 - Boost the quality of teaching and learning
 - Promote excellence

Institutional benefits, complexity

- Global visibility & ranking impact
- Strengthened partnerships
- New research & teaching opportunities

- Alignment of:
 - academic calendars,

 - accreditation process

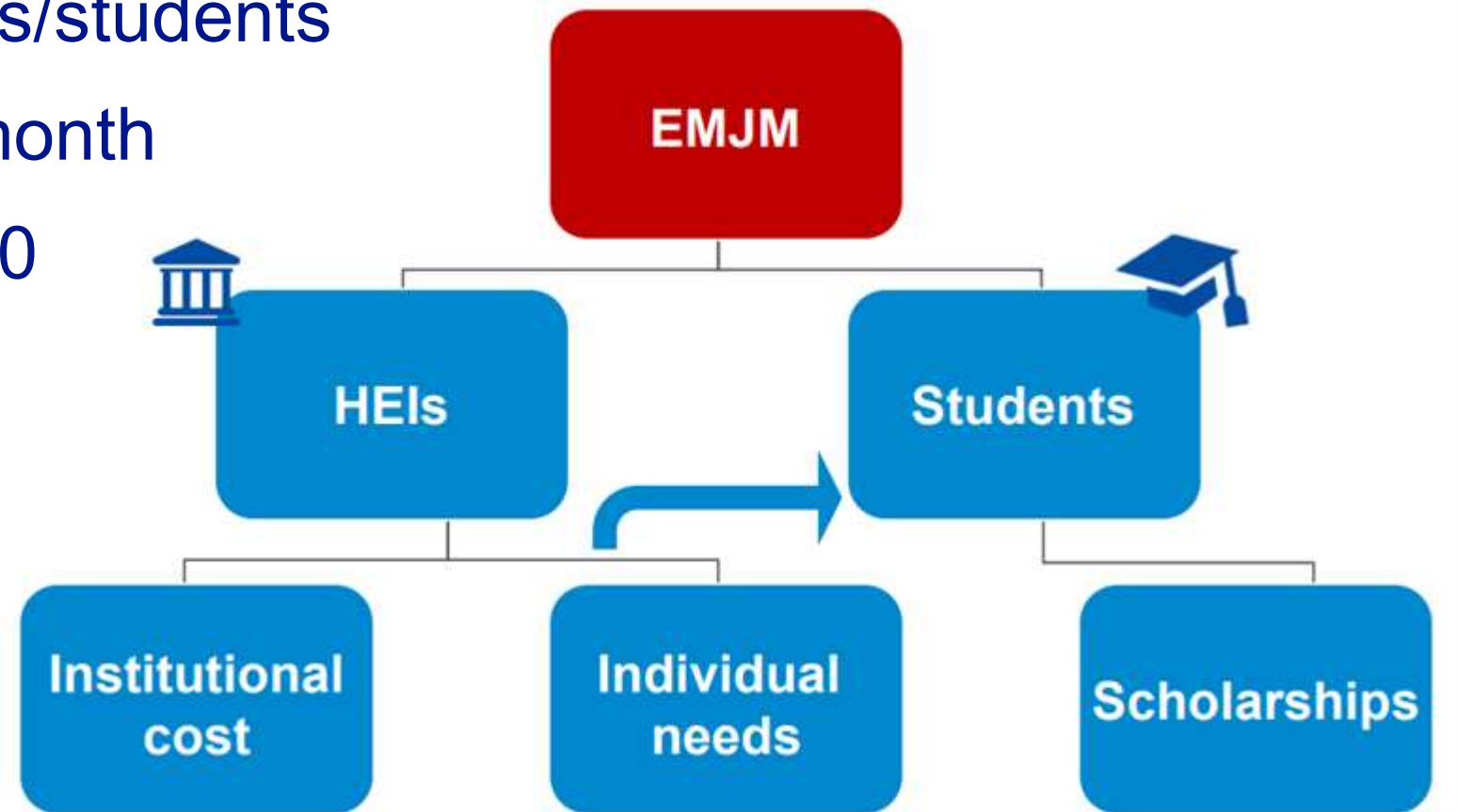


EMJM Set-up

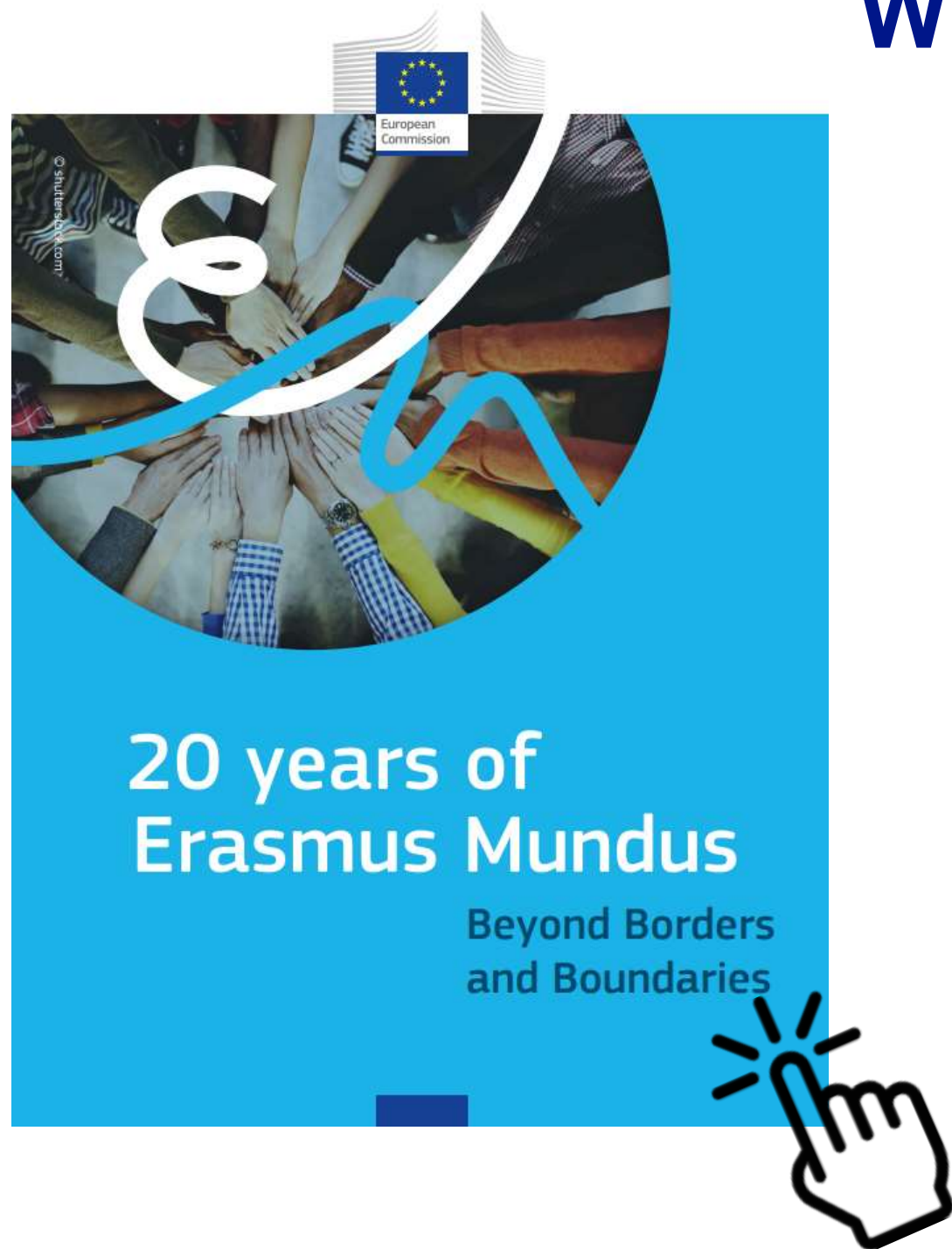
- Consortium: minimum 3 HEIs (3 different countries)
- Duration: 1 or 2 years master programme * 4 editions (74 months)
- Students:
 - Commitment to enrol a certain number
 - Min. 2 study periods (in 2 different countries)
 - Geographical balance

Grant calculation

- Duration of the master programme
- Institutional cost: € 750/months/students
- Student scholarship: € 1400/month
- Individual needs: max € 60 000



Why Erasmus Mundus matters



- Institutional impact: advancements in international cooperation, learning and teaching, student services
- Individual aspects: enhanced intercultural competencies, improved career prospects, personal growth
- National level: catalyst for regulatory reforms

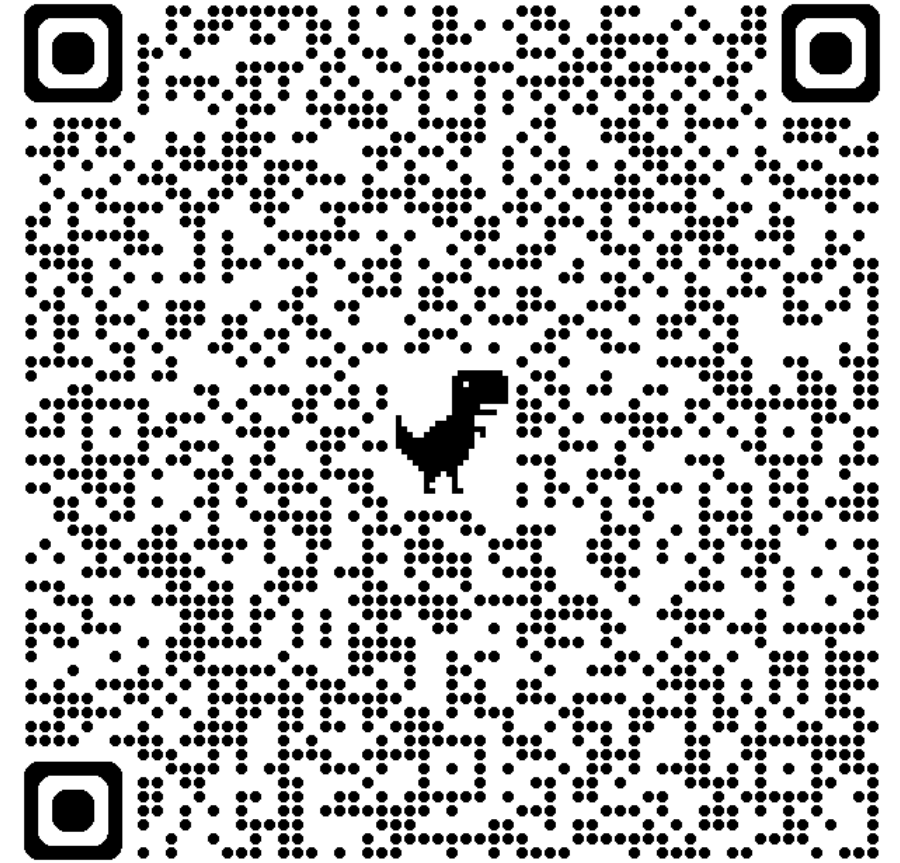

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A general introduction to the Erasmus Mundus Design Measures (EMDM)

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Main features of Erasmus Mundus Design Measures (EMDM)

- ✓ € 60 000 lump sum grant
- ✓ Duration: 15 months
- ✓ Perfect if consortium is not ready for an EMJM yet
- ✓ Independent on Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters (EMJM)

The aims of Erasmus Mundus Design Measures

- ✓ Develop new joint master programmes
- ✓ Attract students globally, increasing diversity and the talent pool, HEIs 'reputation and competitiveness on the global stage
- ✓ Support the development of Erasmus Mundus Joint Master programmes (fully integrated joint curriculum, physical mobility, joint/multiple degree)
- ✓ Foster the development of common mechanisms in HE related to quality assurance, accreditation and recognition of degrees and credits
- ✓ Encourage the development of new, innovative, jointly delivered transnational study programmes at Master level

Who can participate?

- ✓ A mono-beneficiary grant: application to be submitted by a HEI (public or private) based in a programme country holding a valid ECHE
- ✓ HEIs from programme countries and where relevant, partner countries
- ✓ All partners: deliver education at level 7 ISCED 2011
- ✓ Other educational and/or non-educational partners with specific expertise and interest in the concerned study areas/professional domains may also be involved
- ✓ The resulting curriculum should be delivered by at least 3 HEIs from 3 different countries (min. 2 programme countries)

Expected outcomes (I)

A joint Master programme...

- ... with a fully integrated curriculum
- ... aiming at recruiting excellent students worldwide
- ... including compulsory physical mobility
- ... leading to a joint or multiple degrees
- ... adhering to the Standards for QA of Joint Programmes in EHEA

Expected outcomes (II)

- ✓ Joint programme design (teaching and complementary activities)
- ✓ Joint student admission and evaluation rules
- ✓ Joint administrative and financial management strategy
- ✓ Common student services (visas, language courses...)
- ✓ Joint promotion and dissemination
- ✓ Joint degree policy
- ✓ Launch of the accreditation process (European Approach if possible)
- ✓ A draft joint Partnership Agreement
- ✓ A draft joint Student Agreement

Activities that can be funded

Goal: Initiate contacts and collaboration activities to set up a joint Master programme

- ✓ Meetings, conferences
- ✓ Studies/surveys
- ✓ Accreditation/evaluation process (exploring European approach recommended)
- ✓ Staff costs, travel and accommodation costs, administrative costs and sub-contracted activities

Award criteria

Minimum score to be considered for funding: 60 points in total and at least 16 for relevance, 12 for project design, 12 for partnership arrangements and 10 for impact

Impact (max. 20 pts)

Main changes compared to the call 2025

- ✓ Not compulsory to include activities involving HEIs from at least one third (partner) country anymore
- ✓ Alignement with EMJM requirements on consortium composition

- ✓ Deadline: 12 February 2026 17:00 (CET)
- ✓ Grant amount: € 60 000
- ✓ Budget: € 3 mil. (expectation: around 50 EMDM funded)
