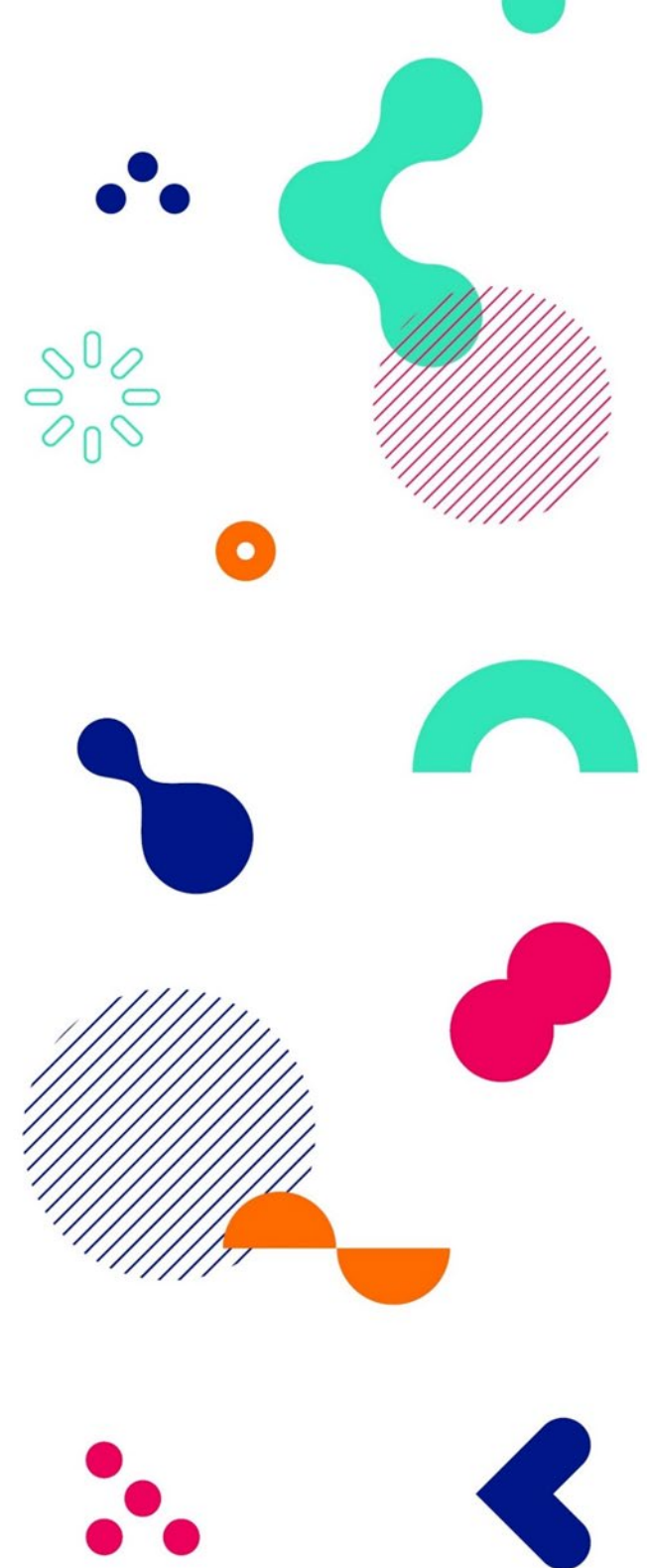

Jean Monnet Actions continue as a single integrated programme



support teaching and research on **EU studies worldwide**

are a vector of a public diplomacy in third countries – promoting **EU values** and enhancing visibility of the EU

are managed centrally by **EACEA**

promote active European citizenship and founding values of the EU, such as freedom, tolerance, and non-discrimination

Jean Monnet Actions...

are dedicated to the memory of **Jean Monnet** (1888-1979)

celebrated **35 years** since the programme started in 1989 (Introduction of European integration studies in universities)

Aim to reach out to a wider public by bringing EU knowledge closer to society

Jean Monnet Actions: a worldwide network since 1989



around **6.932 Jean Monnet Actions** in the field of European studies and European integration

Jean Monnet Beneficiaries in **100+ countries worldwide**, with more than **1000 universities** offering Jean Monnet courses

approximately **9,000 university teachers** who contribute to Jean Monnet courses every year

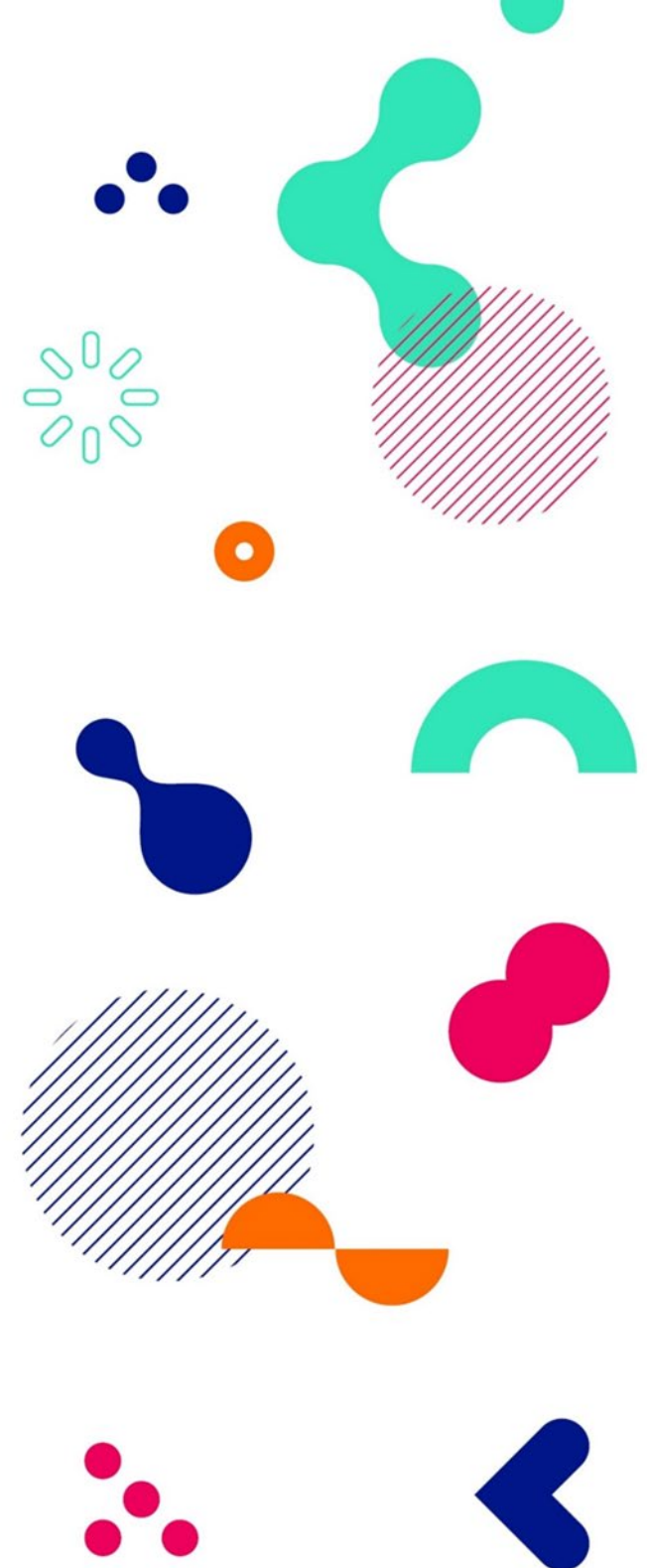

Jean Monnet Actions **in the field of HE**

*Eligibility: HEIs established in EU Member States or the 6 countries associated to the Programme must hold a **valid Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE)**. An ECHE is **not required** for participating HEIs from **the third countries not associated to the Programme**.*

The proposed activities should also include support to participants (e.g. contribution to travel and subsistence, provision of handbooks and other specific tools, exemption from fees).

Jean Monnet **Policy Debate**

Large thematic networks in Higher Education are created in order to **collect, share and discuss** among the partners *research findings, content of courses and experiences, products (studies, articles, etc.)*.

The coordinator of the network: select most innovative and interesting results to be provided to the Commission.

A. Network on internal policy in HE: ***EU enlargement as a catalyst for progress***

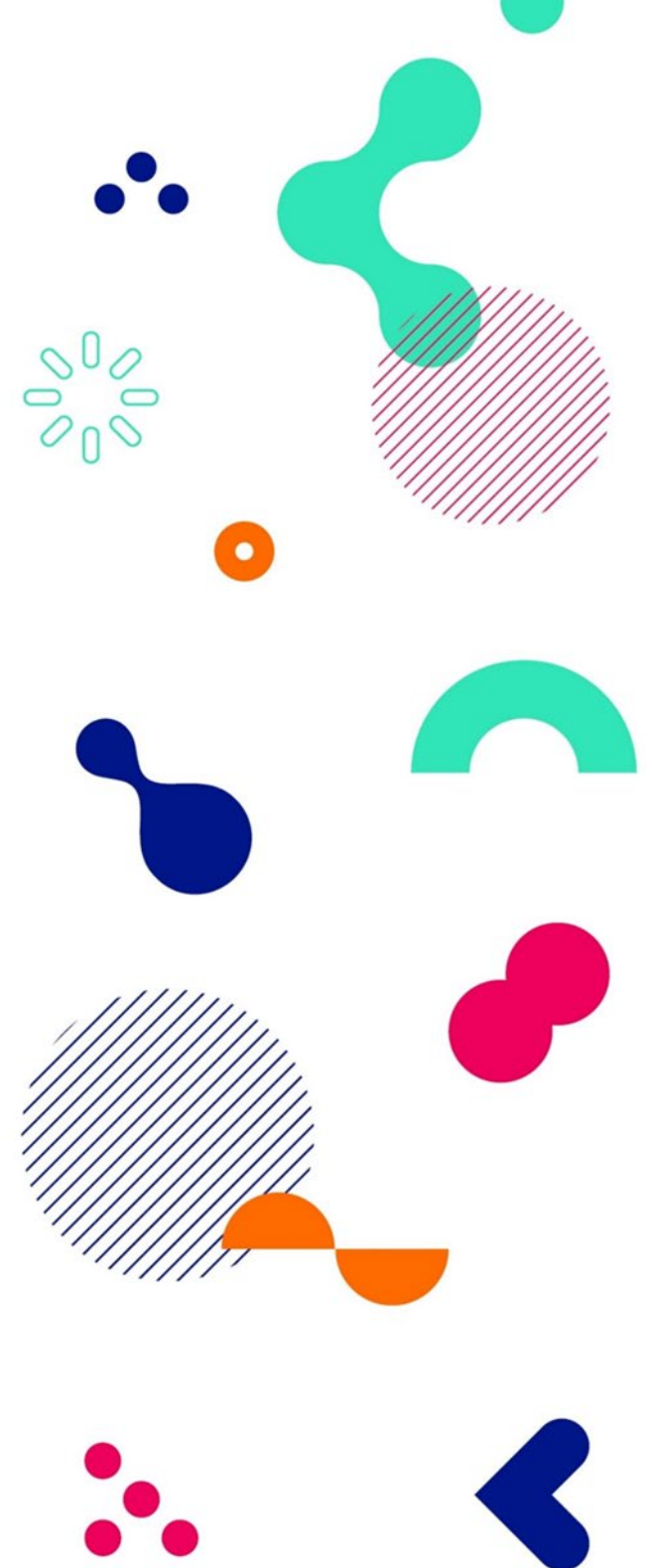
B. Network on external policy in HE: ***EU-North America***

Aim: to provide regular feedback (e.g. an online newsletter) on the most advanced and innovative practices in the field, supporting and adding value to the debate.

*Any HEI in the world – Exception: organisations from Belarus and Russian Federation are not eligible to participate in these actions.
